

Thunderstorms occurred on the 3rd, Gth, 10th, 16th, 17th, 25th to 27th, 30th, and 31st. Hail showers were frequent between the 3rd and 18th. Snow fell on the 6th, 8th, and 9th. Halos were seen on the 1st, 3rd to 5th, 13th, 15th, 16th, 20th, 23rd, 25th, and 31st. Fog occurred on the 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 10th to 14th, 16th, 17th, 21st to 24th, and 26th to 30th. June. The weather diuing this month was fine and dry, with a prevalence of cool winds and consequent low temperature. The mean temperature for the month, 56-3, was l0-4 below the average. The maximum temperatures occurred on the 5th, 29th, and 30th. The highest readings were 78-5 at Seathwaite and 78 3 at Scaleby on the 5th; 77 4 at Hodsock and 77 3 at Hillington on the 29th; and 79-4 at Beddington and 78 7 at Wryde on the 30th. The minimum temperatures took place on the 9th, 10th, 26th, and 28th. The lowest readings were 360-9 at Castle Hill on the 10th; 36 9 at Thurlow on the 26th; and 338 at Hodsock and 35-l at Buxton on the 28th. Atmospheric pressure was generally high, the mean for the month being 30-06 ins., which was-04 in. above the average. The maximum occurred in the north and east on the 1M 4th and...
